MINUTES FROM THE ANNUAL MEETING ON APRIL 19, 2023

The Superior Credit Union 69th Annual Meeting was held April 20th, 2023, at the Allen County Jobs and Family Services Center and by Video Conference. A quorum of members was present. Board of Directors in attendance were Chairman James Bacome, Treasurer Cheryl Lawson, Secretary Kelley Recker, Vice Chairmen Greg Shrader, Board Members Dave Watkins and Joe Patton. Associate Board Member Lynn Carpenter was also present.

Chairman Jim Bacome called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. with a quorum of members present. Chairman Bacome noted the membership has grown to over 102,000. Chairman Bacome acknowledged and welcomed former CEO Bruce Campbell and long-time employee Dorothy Thompson to the meeting. He also thanked the Board, Management Team, and Staff for their service. Chairman Bacome discussed several of the past year's accomplishments including the completion of the Airport Highway Branch in Toledo and opening of an office in Defiance. He also noted the Van Wert Office is currently being completed and a new Wapakoneta facility will be started in 2023.

Treasurer's Report

Chair Bacome noted the Audit Committee Report and Annual Minutes were included in the Annual Meeting Report. The Annual Report and 2022 audited financials are available for members on the credit union's website. Chair Bacome provided a video that included the Treasurer's report and a review of the credit union's 2022 performance for members to review. Over the past year, the credit union's assets exceeded \$1.5 Billion dollars with \$6 million returned to members in dividends. Net income for the year was \$14 million dollars. The credit union remained financially strong with equity over \$200 million and a net equity to assets ratio of over 13%.

President/CEO Report

President/CEO Phil Buell thanked the Board of Directors and committee members for their volunteer service. He also thanked members for their ongoing support. Phil noted the credit union was awarded the Compass Award for youth financial literacy by State Treasurer Ohio Robert Sprague. Superior has coordinated the Real Money, Real World Program for 19 years with local schools helping over 30,000 students. Phil noted the credit union paid members over \$6 million dollars in dividends last year and more is expected in 2023. Phil welcomed the HTM Credit Union members who recently joined Superior in February. With the merger, 3500 new members joined Superior.

Nominating Committee

Nominating Chair Dave Watkins announced the results of the Board of Directors Election. He acknowledged the election was conducted in accordance with the credit union Code of Regulations. This year, the nominees are Joe Patton, Greg Shrader, and Kelley Recker. No other candidates were received, and the nominees are elected by acclamation to three-year terms.

Having no further business, the meeting adjourned at 5:53 p.m.
